
ALICE FAMILIES - Working Hard But Struggling to Survive

Over 44% of the households in our community struggle with financial hardships or are in poverty. The stories below are a snapshot of the thousands of people we want to work with to create pathways to prosperity, but we need your help.



JENNIFER: Pregnant at 19 she put herself through college. But upon graduation she made too much for help with daycare, and was unable to pay all the bills. With no one there to tell her how to fix it, she worked multiple jobs just to juggle expenses. Today Jennifer and her now teenage son are both working to manage it all.



HEATHER: She saves lives, but still lives paycheck to paycheck. On paper, she and her boyfriend look well off, but once you add in all their expenses they just can't get ahead. Because of that, it takes her neighbors and family pitching in to make sure her children are taken care of.

ALICE household survival 650 59 budget for a family of 4:

Survival budget covers housing, child care, food, health care, and transportation, but does not include any savings and leaves a family vulnerable to unexpected expenses.

ALICE is our neighbor, friend, and family member. ALICE makes our coffee, takes care of our loved ones, and prepares meals.




